January/February 2025

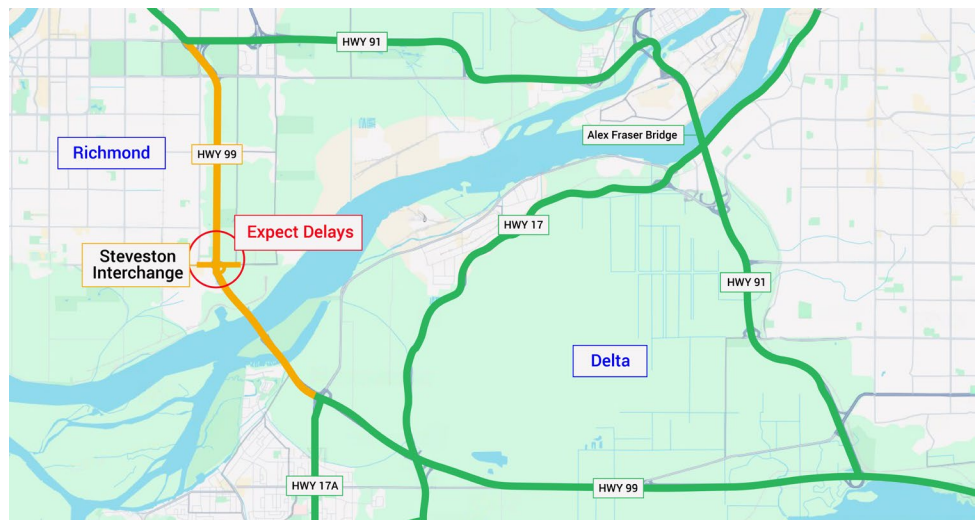
UPDATED January 31: Previously scheduled work on the weekend of January 31-February 3 has been postponed due to the forecasted winter weather event. Work is now scheduled to begin on February 7, 2025. Please visit our [current work page](#) for the latest status updates.

The Steveston Interchange Project has reached a major milestone with the completion of the north half of the new overpass. Next steps include removing the existing overpass and building the new south half in its place. The Project is on track to be completed by fall 2025.

Anticipate Delays

On the weekends of **February 7-10, February 21-24 and February 28-March 3**, drivers can anticipate delays around the Steveston Interchange Project, as crews work to remove the existing overpass.

Please consider alternate routes when possible, such as the Alex Fraser Bridge via Highway 91.

Timing

Friday night to Monday morning on the following weekends:

- > **Weekend #1: February 7 to 10**
- > **Weekend #2: February 21 to 24**
- > **Weekend #3: February 28 to March 3**



Hours of Work

- > 24 hours a day, beginning 9 p.m. Fridays and ending 5 a.m. Mondays

Traffic

- > **Highway 99:** Lane shifts causing delays, however two lanes northbound and two lanes southbound will be maintained at all times; full closure at night
- > **Steveston Highway:** Two-way traffic during the day; periods of single-lane alternating traffic at night
- > **Northbound loop ramp:** Closed during the day and at night and will remain closed until mid-September



Impacts/Interruptions

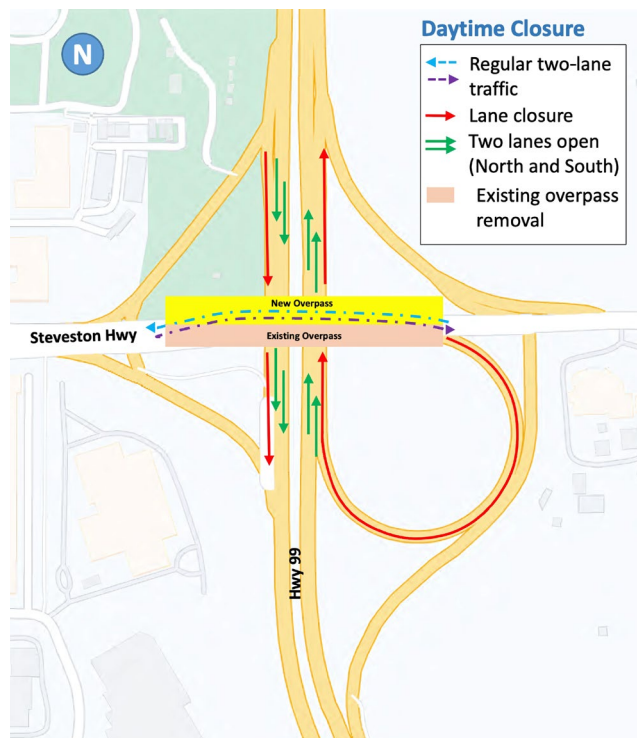
- > Expect traffic delays
- > Noise from construction equipment
- > Construction lighting at night
- > Possible dust generated by removal work
- > Minor impacts to pedestrian routes, please follow signage on site

Traffic-Pattern Changes

Minimizing traffic impacts is a priority for the Project, and we are focused on ensuring traffic continues to flow in all directions during the removal of the existing overpass. The following describes the traffic-pattern changes at different hours over the upcoming weekends:

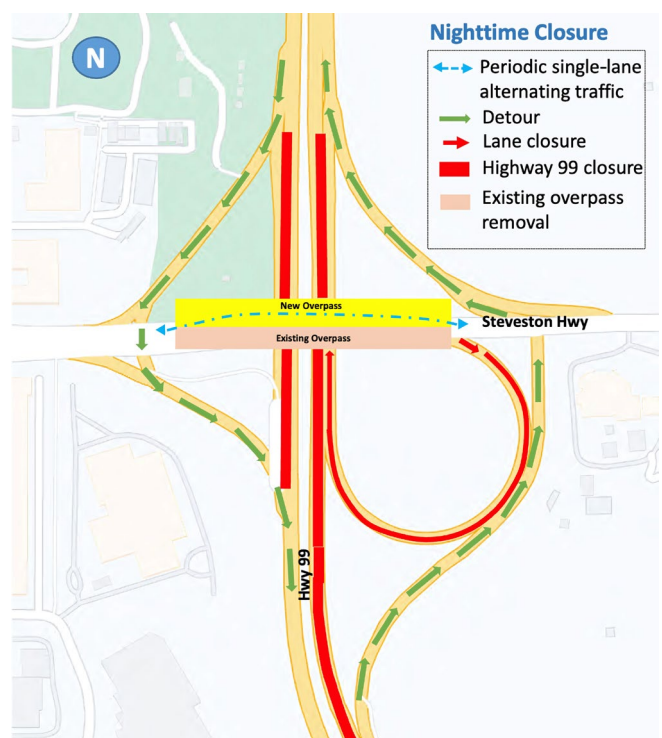
Daytime

8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday & Sunday



Nighttime

9 p.m. to 8 a.m. Friday-Saturday & Saturday-Sunday
9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Sunday-Monday

Daytime:

- **Highway 99** lane shifts causing delays, however two lanes northbound and two lanes southbound will be maintained at all times
- **Steveston Highway** two-way traffic maintained
- **Northbound loop ramp** onto Highway 99 closed with an eastbound; two-lane left turn signal onto the northside ramp detour in place

Nighttime:

- **Highway 99** closed; vehicles detoured using the on- and off-ramps along Steveston Highway
- **Steveston Highway** periods of single-lane alternating traffic
- **Northbound loop ramp** onto Highway 99 closed with an eastbound; two-lane left turn signal onto the northside ramp detour in place

Work is weather-dependent and may be rescheduled should conditions on the weekend be unfavourable.
