





## Steveston Interchange Project Ground Improvement & Bridge Foundation Work

## February 2025

<u>UPDATED February 27: Occasional weekend work may be necessary to complete this stage of the Project. If needed, weekend work will be limited to the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. to minimize disruptions.</u>

Work to remove the existing Steveston Highway Overpass is nearing completion, and ground improvement and pile driving activities are getting underway as we enter Phase 2 of the Project.



Starting the week of February 17 and lasting for approximately three months, crews will begin stone column installation and pile driving work in the southwest and southeast quadrants of the Project.


The activities will both increase ground stability and create a strong foundation for the Phase 2 overpass. Ground improvements are common for construction Projects in Richmond due to ground conditions in the area.

Stone column and piling work is expected to generate noise and vibrations, which will sound like mechanical hammering. The work is being limited to daytime hours to minimize disruptions.

The overpass sidewalk will remain unaffected, and no impacts are expected for the Highway 99 bus stop.

Drivers are reminded that while Phase 2 of the Steveston Interchange Project is under construction, the northbound loop ramp will be closed with a two-lane left turn signal onto the northside ramp detour in place.
